



Welcome to Eungella Dam

Thank you for visiting Eungella Dam. SunWater encourages all visitors to help keep our dam recreational facilities a fun, safe place to relax and have a good time. Please take note of the below guidelines for your safety and enjoyment.

Read the signs, don't take risks, stay safe

For your own safety, please take note of the signs around the dam. The signs indicate hazards to watch out for and areas to avoid. Keep an eye on your children and inform them of the hazards and where they are allowed to go. Visitors are required to comply with all relevant laws whilst on SunWater property.

Mobile phone coverage

Please note, there is very limited phone coverage at Eungella Dam.

Boating, skiing and other water activities

Boating, skiing and other water activities are not permitted within the buoy line, 200m upstream of the Eungella Dam wall.

Fishing

Fishing is not permitted within the buoy line, 200m upstream of the Eungella Dam wall.

A Stocked Impoundment Permit is required to fish at Eungella Dam. Call Fisheries Queensland on 13 25 23 to locate your nearest fishing permit outlet or apply online at www.qld.gov.au/recreation/activities/boating-fishing/rec-fishing/dams

Camping

Camping is available at Eungella Dam. Fees apply and can be paid at the self registration station located camping area toilet block or online using BPAY (see Permit to Camp for details). The maximum allowed stay is four weeks.

For reasons of safety, camping is not permitted within 5 metres of the lake water line.

Please refer to the camping rules on the reverse of the Permit to Camp document (available at the camping area) for a list of all camping rules.

Pets

For everyone's enjoyment and safety, please keep your pet on a leash or restrained during your stay.

Motorcycles

The recreational operation of registered and unregistered motorcycles and four wheelers within the camping area and the surrounding private property is strictly prohibited.

The speed limit in the camping area is 20km/h.

Open fires and barbeques

Open camp fires are permitted at the Eungella camp ground unless fire restrictions are in place. For current fire restriction information, visit www.ruralfire.qld.gov.au or phone the Mackay Rural Fire Service Area Office on 4965 6641.

Wood-fired barbeques are available at the Eungella Dam picnic area.

To report an uncontrolled fire, please contact 000.

Rubbish

Help us to keep the recreational areas clean and tidy by using the rubbish bins provided. If the rubbish bins are full please take your rubbish with you.

The disposal of Redclaw crayfish remains in the rubbish bins is not permitted. Please take Redclaw remains with you when you leave.

Antisocial behaviour

If you observe vandalism, antisocial behaviour or any illegal activities please contact the Police immediately on 000 so we can keep the recreational areas safe and enjoyable for all.

Help stop the spread of weeds and pests

Please keep your vehicles, trailers and boats clean to limit transfer of weeds and pests when entering and leaving this area.

Commercial, club or large group activities

Commercial, club or large group activities require advance approval from SunWater. Please contact SunWater on **13 15 89** at least three weeks ahead to discuss your event and arrange for appropriate approvals.

Eungella Dam Facts

- Eungella Dam is an earth and rockfill embankment dam.
- Construction of Eungella Dam was completed in 1969.
- Eungella Dam has a storage capacity of 112,400 megalitres.
- Eungella Dam provides water to the Collinsville Power Station, irrigation customers in the Bowen Broken Rivers irrigation area and coalfields near Moranbah.

Getting there

From Eungella (32 km)

Head south from Eungella on Eungella Dam Road for 32 kms until you reach the dam.

From Mackay (115 km)

From Mackay, head west on the Peak Downs Highway for 6.4km then, following the signs to Eungella, turn right onto Mackay Eungella Road. Follow Mackay Eungella Road for 70 kms until you reach the town of Eungella.

From Eungella, head south on Eungella Dam Road for 32 kms until you reach the dam.
